**EMILIE CLARK**, a New York artist, spent four months at the **BROOKLYN BOTANIC GARDEN** as its first artist in residence, exploring the work of the 19th-century American naturalist Mary Treat. The result is "My Garden Pets," an installation that includes works on paper, a Victorian terrarium and an audio piece drawn from Treat's correspondence with Charles Darwin and Asa Gray, the American botanist. *Through May 31, 1000 Washington Avenue, Prospect Heights, (718) 623-7200, bbg.org.*

In 1907 Theodore M. Davis, an American businessman, unearthed remains from the mummification and funeral of the Egyptian pharaoh Tutankhamun that had been buried near his tomb around 1327 B.C. Two years later Davis donated the objects to the **METROPOLITAN MUSEUM OF ART**. On Tuesday the museum will open an exhibition of the cache's most important pieces. The show, "**TUTANKHAMUN'S FUNERAL**," will feature ceramic dishes from the funeral meal, bags of sawdust from the embalming process and collars of real flowers that were probably intended for the mummy but never used. Other highlights include a sculptured head of Tutankhamun and facsimile paintings of contemporary funerary rituals. *Through Sept. 6, metmuseum.org.*
